#### **About the Center**

The Illinois Center for Transition and Work (ICTW) is a statewide training and technical assistance center specifically focused on transition from school to work for students with disabilities who have extensive support needs (i.e., intellectual disability, autism, multiple disabilities). The ICTW is funded through a grant from the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE).

#### **Mission**

The ICTW is a statewide resource that utilizes research to develop products, deliver professional development, and provide technical assistance to enhance the transition from school to work for students with disabilities who have extensive support needs.

## **ICTW Symposium**

Designed for special education and rehabilitation professionals, the ICTW Symposium focuses on career development and transition to work for students with disabilities, with particular focus on students with extensive support needs. Through a variety of keynote and breakout sessions, participants learn about current research, practice, and policy specific to preparing students for employment. ### **Targeted Technical Assistance**

Targeted Technical Assistance (TTA) is designed to support educators in creating substantive changes within their school district or educational program that improve employment outcomes for students with extensive support needs. Educational teams who engage in TTA will work in cooperation with the ICTW to jointly develop an action plan that defines the steps to achieving the applicant's goals, the roles and responsibilities of both the ICTW and the applicant, and the types of assistance to be provided by the ICTW. Proposed changes should improve work-based learning experiences, enhance coordination with adult service agencies, and/ or meet other school-identified needs related to preparing students with extensive support needs for employment.
