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To address these challenges, transition professionals need to utilize culturally responsive practices that take into consideration the beliefs, values, and experiences of the CLD student and their family.

Culturally responsive practices honor diversity by creating a supportive and inclusive environment that results in effective, meaningful, and relevant post-secondary plans for CLD students.

Using collaborative transition planning practices that involve the individual and their family will support the development of transition plans that align with the family's cultural perspectives, beliefs, preferences, and goals.
